#### CNT's Purchasing Requirements for Sterling Silver

Thank you for using CNT as your sterling purchaser. We appreciate the level of trust you put in us and our service.

Due to a widespread issue with sterling silver melts assaying low, CNT has developed a system to allow us to continue to purchase sterling at competitive rates while offering other purchasing options for your non sterling silver items.

Please refer to the following slides as a guide outlining how CNT purchases sterling silver and silver items for melt. Please note the pictures provided are meant to show examples of the points referenced.

# Flatware Preparation

For CNT to purchase your flatware outright as sterling silver:

- Must be clearly marked 'sterling' or '.925' (image 1)
  - If you have a run of a specific pattern, please segregate it in a plastic bag for quicker sorting
- Must be from a known maker
  - English style markings or hallmarks are not acceptable as they often only test 80%-90% silver (image 2)
- Must be non filled flatware
  - We are NOT purchasing any 'split' or 'cut out' flatware as there is lead residue in these cut outs (image 3)
  - Filled knives that are INTACT will be purchased using a flat conversion of 1/20z per large knife and 1/40z per small knife (image 4)
- Please note that all flatware must be booked separate from holloware.

## Holloware Preparation

For CNT to purchase your holloware outright as sterling silver:

- Must be clearly marked 'sterling' or '.925' (image 1)
  - This marking should be circled or otherwise marked
- Must be from a known maker
  - English style markings or hallmarks are not acceptable as they often only test 80%-90% silver (image 2)
- Must be non filled
  - We are NOT purchasing any 'split' or 'cut out' holloware as there is lead residue in these cut outs (image 3)
- Please note that all holloware must be booked separate from flatware.

### Private Mints and Coinage

For CNT to purchase your coinage and private mint items outright as sterling silver:

- Must be clearly marked 'sterling' or '.925' and this marking must be circled or otherwise identified (image 1)
  - Rounds will often be marked on the side (image 2)
  - bars may carry markings on the side or the obverse/reverse (image 3)
- Coinage must be known sterling (image 4)
  - There are many coins that are .800, .500, or other purities
- If you are unsure on coinage, it should be sold as melt.

## Items CNT Buys as Melt

The following items are examples of silver CNT will purchase as melt:

- Flatware and holloware marked less than
  .925 (image 1)
- Flatware or holloware with English style hallmarks (image 2)
- Jewelry, wire, other pieces from larger sterling items (images 3 and 4)
- These items **CANNOT** be accepted
  - Filled
  - Marked non silver or plated








Image 1: Silver plated

# Unacceptable Items

These items are UNACCEPTABLE and CNT WILL NOT purchase them in any capacity:

- Silver plated items (image 1)
- Unmarked flatware or holloware
- Items still filled with their weighting material (image 2)
